




....Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before.


So Daniel 1:19–20 (NIV)


Daniel 6:4–5 (NIV)

seventy years.




Daniel 9:3–5 (NIV)




Daniel 10:12–14 (NIV)



2 Chronicles 20:3–4 (NIV)



You will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the Lord will give you, Judah and Jerusalem...




2 Chronicles 20:22–23 (NIV)
