Luke 3:2 ... the word of God came to John... and he went...

Luke 3:4-6 4... "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the LORD; Make His paths straight. 5 Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill brought low; the crooked places shall be made straight And the rough ways smooth; 6 and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'

Perception change: the valley of failure is a graveyard for many, but the birthplace of the mighty.

Failure speaks loudly

Valley of failure – speaks loudly!

(1) *It says: "you are the problem." Failure is an identity issue. "You didn't fail, you are a failure."

Our response: if at first you don't succeed, destroy all evidence that you've tried." Failure – we hide it, deny it, fear it, ignore it and hate it.

- (2) It changes our perspective
- (3) It says: God isn't with you."
- (4) Graveyard: many a man and woman have made their grave in the valley of failure.

How do we break out of the valley of failure?

Luke 5:4 (NKJV) ⁴ When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch."

Luke 5:5 (NKJV) ⁵ But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net."

Luke 5:6 (NKJV) ⁶ And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking.

Luke 5:8-9 (NKJV) ⁸ When Simon Peter saw *it*, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for **I am** a sinful man, O Lord!" ⁹ For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken;

Failure speaks loudly to us, but the word of God speaks even louder:

Why the word of God? God is an objective source of truth.

Perception change:

- (1) Failure, our best friend + teacher
- (2) Failure, is simply practice for success

"When we give ourselves permission to fail, we at the same time give ourselves permission to excel."

Why does God's word speak louder?

- (1) Gives us perspective
- (2) Gives us hope

"We are pastors who refused to recant our belief in Jesus and were held in solitary confinement, with total silence, unable to speak or sing aloud. Later I found out that those who did not know scripture or sing hymns, either recanted and denounced Christ or committed suicide. I know of no exceptions. It was the word of God that kept us from doing any of the three."

(3) Turns failure into a success

"He shall rise": Jesus dying on the cross is the ultimate failure. Yet God turned it around into the ultimate victory of all time. The word said: after three days He will rise. He did.

Luke 4:4 (NKJV) ⁴ But Jesus answered him, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not <u>live</u> by bread alone, but by <u>every</u> word of God.' "

Psalm 119:28 (NKJV) ²⁸ My soul melts from heaviness; strengthen me according to Your word.
