Title: Not loving our lives II – the power of the tongue

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\*The words we speak will always be followed by something or someone.

Words are more powerful than what we think.

#### Words create.

Genesis 1:1–3 (NKJV) <sup>1</sup> In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. <sup>2</sup> The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And <u>the Spirit of God was hovering</u> over the face of the waters. <sup>3</sup> Then <u>God said</u>, "Let there be light"; and there was light.

### Words don't fade away: they are recorded in eternity

Matthew 12:36 (NKJV) <sup>36</sup> But I say to you that for <u>every idle word men may speak</u>, they will give account of it in the day of judgment.

**Words affect people:** Our words are always followed by something. Causing either life or death.

Proverbs 12:18 (NKJV) <sup>18</sup> There is one who speaks like the <u>piercings of a sword</u>, but the tongue of the wise <u>promotes</u> health.

Proverbs 11:9 (NKJV) <sup>9</sup> The hypocrite <u>with his mouth destroys his neighbor</u>, But through knowledge the righteous will be delivered.

# Words affect our surroundings: cities and regions

Proverbs 11:11 (NKJV) <sup>11</sup> By the blessing of the upright the city is exalted, but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked.

## Words open doors (or close them)

Psalm 24:7–10 (NKJV) <sup>7</sup> Lift up your heads, O you gates! And <u>be lifted up</u>, you everlasting doors! And the King of glory <u>shall come in</u>. <sup>8</sup> Who is this King of glory? The LORD strong and mighty, The LORD mighty in battle. <sup>9</sup> Lift up your heads, O you gates! Lift up, you everlasting doors! And the King of glory shall come in. <sup>10</sup> Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, He is the King of glory. Selah

Joshua 6:10 (NKJV) <sup>10</sup> Now Joshua had commanded the people, saying, "You shall <u>not shout</u> or make <u>any noise</u> with your voice, <u>nor shall a word proceed out of your mouth</u>, until the day I say to you, 'Shout!' Then you shall shout."

Joshua 6:16 (NKJV) <sup>16</sup> And the seventh time it happened, when the priests <u>blew the trumpets</u>, that Joshua said to the people: "Shout, for the LORD has given you the city!

Joshua 6:20 (NKJV) <sup>20</sup> So the people shouted when the priests blew the trumpets. And it happened when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat. Then the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

• Our words are always followed by something. Gates are opened.

# Words followed by death

Proverbs 18:21 (NKJV) <sup>21</sup> Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

James 3:2 (NLT) <sup>2</sup> Indeed, we all make many mistakes. For if we <u>could control our tongues</u>, we would be <u>perfect</u> and could also control ourselves in every other way.

James 3:4–8 (NLT) <sup>4</sup> And a small rudder makes a huge ship turn wherever the pilot chooses to go, even though the winds are strong.<sup>5</sup> In the same way, the tongue is a small thing that makes grand speeches. But a <u>tiny spark</u> can set a great forest on fire.<sup>6</sup> And the tongue is a flame of fire. It is a whole world of wickedness, <u>corrupting your entire body</u>. It can set your <u>whole life on fire</u>, for it is set on <u>fire by hell itself</u>.<sup>7</sup> People can tame all kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and fish,<sup>8</sup> but <u>no one can tame the tongue</u>. It is restless and evil, <u>full of deadly poison</u>.

**Order:** first the word, **then** the fire of God or the fire of hell... our words are always followed by something or someone else...

## Words followed by life

One of our values as a church – the power of belief: "We focus our thoughts and words on that which is praiseworthy. At every meeting, small group and service we <u>make an effort</u> to declare that which is praiseworthy. Our aim is to <u>create an environment of praise</u>, of hope and belief that says our God can do anything, even in the greatest of challenges."

Ephesians 4:29 (NKJV) <sup>29</sup> Let <u>no corrupt word</u> proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may <u>impart grace</u> to the hearers.

# What I do have I give you – the words we speak will always be followed by something or someone... Jesus.

Acts 3:6–8 (NKJV) <sup>6</sup> Then Peter said, "Silver and gold <u>I do not have</u>, but <u>what I do have</u> I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk." <sup>7</sup> And he took him by the right hand and lifted him up, and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength. <sup>8</sup> So he, leaping up, stood and walked and entered the temple with them—walking, leaping, and praising God.

**Peter didn't ask. He spoke.** He spoke not in his own name, but in the name of Jesus Christ. **He didn't have his own agenda. He had a God ambition.** 

• **Do not negate the will and power of God because of your unbelieving words... doubt?** Be quiet. **Believe?** Speak!!

## Dying to self:

A guard over our mouths - pray daily. Bite your tongue... control your whole life.

Psalm 141:3 (NKJV) <sup>3</sup> Set a guard, O LORD, over my mouth; <u>Keep watch</u> over the door of my lips.
