Luke 12 we meet a rich man.

What did God have to say to this man? "You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?"

Jesus added: "This is how it will be with anyone who stores up things for himself but is not rich toward God." (Luke 12:20-21)
