Kingdom within

Luke 17:20–21 (NKJV) "The kingdom of God does not come with observation; ²¹ nor will they say, 'See here!' or 'See there!' For indeed, the kingdom of God is <u>within you."</u>

- The kingdom cannot come through us, if it doesn't first come in us.
- How? Surrender to the Spirit.

Willing and obedient

Isaiah 1:19–20 (NKJV) ¹⁹ If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land; ²⁰ But if you refuse and rebel, you shall be devoured by the sword"; For the mouth of the LORD has spoken.

- Willing? Hearts completely devoted to the will of God.
- **Obedient?** Doing the will of God to the letter. Not 90%. 100%.
- **Refuse / rebel?** Stubbornness. (1) Choosing our own path. (2) Not consult God (3) Ignoring commands of scripture (4) Authority issues

Pursuing own gain

Ezekiel 33:31 (NKJV) ³¹ So they come to you as people do, they sit before you as My people, and they hear your words, but they <u>do not do them</u>; for with their mouth they show much love, but <u>their hearts pursue their</u> own gain.

• We desire all the good things of God, but we are unwilling to do the will of God.

Holiness – preparing for the Holy Spirit

Ignoring sin in our lives, thinking that God doesn't see, or maybe it isn't a serious issue.

1 Corinthians 6:18–20 (ESV) ¹⁸ Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins <u>against his own body</u>. ¹⁹ Or do you not know that your body <u>is a temple of the Holy Spirit</u> within you, whom you have from God? <u>You are not your own</u>, ²⁰ for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

- You are not your own
- Ask yourself: Am I glorifying God in my body?

Joshua 3:5 (NLT) ⁵ Then Joshua told the people, "Purify yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do great wonders among you."

• First purity, then power.

Hardness of heart

Mark 3:1–5 (NKJV) ¹ And He entered the synagogue again, and a man was there who had a withered hand. ² So they watched Him closely, whether He would heal him on the Sabbath, so that they might accuse Him. ³ And He said to the man who had the withered hand, "Step forward." ⁴ Then He said to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they kept silent. ⁵ And when He had looked around at them with anger, being grieved by the hardness of their hearts, He said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." And he stretched it out, and his hand was restored as whole as the other.

- Jesus does become angry sometimes, yet He is slow to anger.
- They were religious, yet they had lacked love. Their hearts were hard.

Acts 7:51 (NKJV) ⁵¹ "You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you.

Conclusion

The kingdom must first come in us, before it can come through us.

- 1. Unloving: Does the love of Christ reign in your heart?
- 2. Selfish: Are you serving God because you want to please Him at all cost?
- 3. Sin: Are you ruthlessly dealing with sin in your life?
- 4. Hard heart: Is your heart hard?
