Death? It has a positive impact on us.

Death? It can also have negative impact on us: Always of good courage - To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord! (2 Cor 5:6)

Why speak of Eternity?

Colossians 3:1–2 (ESV) 1 If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.

- "If then you were raised with Christ" living from a place of victory
- Living from a place of failure We become earthly again if our minds are set on earthly things

 **"Aim at heaven and receive heaven and earth. Aim at earth and receive neither." What are you aiming at?
- Our destiny To be change agents / Heaven come to earth
 - o Or: Conformed agents (*secret agents!) / What are we pursuing!? What should we pursue?

*Life motto - To live is Christ, to die is gain

Philippians 1:21–24 (ESV) ²¹ **For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.** ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that <u>means fruitful labor</u> for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³ I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴ But to <u>remain in the flesh is more necessary</u> on your account.

Christ-centred life

• My desire is for Him! "My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better"

Mission-focused life

You will live a Mission-focused life: "To live is Christ..." A very defined mission. That mission is Christ.

"But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account:" "For the sake of the mission, I need to stay..."

You will produce fruit

A life worthy of Christ

Philippians 1:27–28 (ESV) ²⁷ Only let <u>your manner of life be worthy</u> of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you <u>are standing firm</u> in <u>one spirit</u>, with <u>one mind</u> striving side by side for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ and <u>not frightened in anything</u> by your opponents. This is a clear sign to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God.

Manner of life be worthy – Our message is powerless if our lifestyle doesn't back it up. **Many a Christian has confessed Christ with their mouths, but denied Him by their lifestyle.*

**Only behave as "citizens" worthy of the gospel... Phil 3:20 our citizenship is in heaven... / We are citizens from another kingdom.

Standing firm + in unity - for the sake of the mission we need so stand together.

Unity – eternal mindset causes us to be united. Unified. Stand together. We know relationships will continue in heaven! That is our best investment ever! / **One spirit** – seated with Christ in the heavenlies / **One mind** – eternally minded, not earthly minded / **One mission** – striving side by side for the faith of the gospel

What will be your last words? Here are some from other people:

"Nothing matters. Nothing matters" (Louis B. Mayer, film producer; died October 29, 1957).

"It is very beautiful over there" (Thomas Edison, inventor; died October 18, 1931; he may have been referring to the view outside of his window).

"I'm bored with it all" (Winston Churchill, statesman; died January 24, 1965; after saying this, he slipped into a coma and died nine days later).

"Am I dying, or is this my birthday?" (Lady Nancy Astor; died 1964; after waking briefly during her last illness and finding all her family around her).

"Why, yes, a bulletproof vest" (Domonic Willard, a foot soldier during the Prohibition, just before his death by firing squad, in response to being asked if he had any last requests).
