What is greatness?

Matthew 5:5 (NKJV) ⁵ Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

What is greatness? There **are different platforms in the world** that represents greatness in a worldly sense. Those who succeed on these platforms are the greatest of the great.

*But how does God define greatness?

The United States has become a place **where entertainers** and **professional athletes** <u>are mistaken</u> for people of importance. -Robert A. Heinlein

Matthew 23:11–12 (NKJV) ¹¹ But he who is **greatest** among you <u>shall be your servant</u>. ¹² And whoever <u>exalts</u> <u>himself</u> will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.

Greatness is measured in service, not performance, achievement or gifting. Why? Because the gifts enabling you to achieve comes from God, but to use those gifts for serving others, that amounts to greatness!

"Can I trust you?"

Matthew 5:5 (NKJV) ⁵ Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

*"Can I trust you?" Greatness in the kingdom is someone whom God can trust. The meek can be trusted for they are not self-centred, but Christ-centred.

*People: People are God's treasure, He is not so worried about money and stuff. Can He trust us with people?

*Stuff: "God is looking for people who don't love the world, so that He can give them the world" (Bill Johnson)

Luke 9:25 (NKJV) ²⁵ For what profit is it to a man **if he gains the whole world**, and is <u>himself destroyed</u> or lost?

It's impossible for a self-centred person to be meek. They will explode, they will manipulate, control and damage others.

Meekness or lowly - "behold your king is coming <u>lowly</u>, sitting on a donkey"

Defining Meekness - patient, self-controlled, humble, gentle, unassuming. **Meekness is not weakness, but** power under perfect control. Christ-centred, not self centred.

It's not about you

Matthew 20:26–28 (NKJV) ²⁶ Yet <u>it shall not be so among you</u>; but whoever <u>desires to become great</u> among you, let him **be your servant**. ²⁷ And <u>whoever desires to be first</u> among you, **let him be your slave**— ²⁸ just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, **but to serve**, and **to give His life** a ransom for many."

Why have we been saved? We are saved to serve.

*It's not about you. The universe doesn't revolve around you. It revolves around God. It's about Him. Jesus came to serve. When we serve, we look like Jesus. Our greatest privilege is to serve others.

**You must get an outflow. Without an outflow you will die (spiritually).

The surrendered servant (prodigal son) - our journey to maturity

"We sometimes forget: gifts are free, maturity is expensive. An overemphasis on impartation is dangerous. Faithfulness in service is the only way to maturity. There is no shortcut to maturity." (Bill Johnson)

Luke 15:17–23 (NKJV) ¹⁷ "But <u>when he came to himself...</u>²⁰ "And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. ²¹ And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and <u>am no longer worthy to be called your son.</u>' ²² "But the father said to his servants, 'Bring out the **best robe** and put it on him, and **put a ring** on his hand and **sandals on his feet**.

The selfish son, became the surrendered servant and qualified to become the exalted son. It's a journey.
