## slowing down & the glory of nothingness

- Boredom challenge -

sensation & fascination vs quiet togetherness;

Distraction & 'helicopter' parents - the entertainment abomination

- beyond words & awkward silence
- simplicity & peace; a de-accessorized existence, reduced to zero
- mediating Christ's peace

- the beautiful mundane quietly alert & focussed, relaxed (no striving & anxiety)
- presence metaphors
  - salt and leaven surreptitious/subtle
  - & irremovable (virtual missions)
- capacity constraints at peace with personal weakness/incapacity



- pressure-motivation eg false-guilt, shame (slavery/bondage - Romans 8: 15-16)
- vulnerability (emotional-spiritual) insecurity > pride; intimidation
- mother-need > trust & commitment issues with 'church'/body
