Jesus institutes the Lord's supper

Luke 22

14 When the hour had come, He sat down, and the [b]twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, "With fervent desire I have desired to eat <u>this Passover</u> with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

17 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves; 18 for I say to you, [c] I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

Jesus institutes the Lord's supper

Luke 22

19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

20 Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.

Jesus - known for?

Luke 24

30 Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight.

35 And they told about the things that had happened on the road, <u>and how He was [i]known</u> to them in the breaking of bread.

Many suppers...

- Last supper: not the first or only supper
- Jesus "Frequent, significant, controversial eater"
- "Jesus was killed because of the way he ate.."
- More suppers post resurrection (John 21; Luke 24)

Corinth - 1 Cor 11

23 For I <u>received</u> from the Lord that which I also <u>delivered</u> to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, [d]"Take, eat; this is My body which is [e]broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 25 In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." 26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.
