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Thanksgiving in the Old Testament	
Yadah (Hebrew verb) = to throw, to give thanks, laud or praise;	
to confess something about God; to confess one's own sin	
40x times (referring to thanksgiving)	

Thanksgiving in the Old Testament	
Todah (Hebrew noun)	
 confession, praise, thanksgiving; giving of praise to God; thanksgiving in songs of worship; thanksgiving choir or procession; 	
thank-offering, sacrifice of thanksgiving;	
24x times (referring to thanksgiving)	
Thanksgiving in the New Testament	
Eucharisteo (Greek noun) Eucharistea (verb form)	
= thankfulness; the giving of thanks;	
mindful of favours, grateful, thankful;	
54x times	
The effects of thanksgiving	
Giving thanks ushers us into His presence	
Enter his gates with thanksgiving	
and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.	
Psalm 100:4 NIV	

The effects of thanksgiving

2. Giving thanks shifts our perspective

Scripture says to 'set you hearts and minds on things above' (Col 3:1-2)

Giving thanks reminds us of who God is and what He's done – it focuses our attention on Him, and gives us an eternal perspective

The effects of thanksgiving

3. Giving thanks blesses God

One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet **and thanked him**—and he was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?"

The effects of thanksgiving

4. Giving thanks is a way of waging war 'Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's. Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the Lord and to praise him for the splendour of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying: "Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever." As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes...and [the enemies] were defeated.

2. It seems inauthentic when I'm not feeling it	
Todah also means 'a sacrifice of praise',	
meaning sometimes giving thanks will cost us something. It might cost us our current	
experience or emotions.	
Giving thanks is actually a powerful way to cultivating a thankful heart!	

Barriers to thanksgiving

Why we sometimes struggle

- 3. Complaining is deeply engrained in our minds
- The enemy knows the power of thanksgiving
- Our culture is largely one of entitlement and discontentment
- Some of us grew up in homes, communities where complaining was the native language
