Biblical laborer:

1. always trusts God to share with others

John 4:28-30

 28 The woman then left her water pot, went her way into the city, and said to the men, 29 "Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?" 30 Then they went out of the city and came to Him.

2. a laborer's only concern is doing the will of God

John 4:31-34

³¹ In the meantime His disciples urged Him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." ³² But He said to them, "I have food to eat of which you do not know." ³³ Therefore the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought Him *anything to eat?"* ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work.

Heb 5-12

For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you <u>need someone to teach you</u> again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to <u>need milk</u> and <u>not solid food</u>.

3. a laborer always has an outward focus

John 4:35

Do you not say, 'There are still four months and then comes the harvest'? Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest!

4. a laborer has compassion for the harvest

Matt 9:35-37

³⁵ Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. ³⁶ But when

He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd. 37 Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly *is plentiful, but the laborers are few.*

a: love is demonstrative

John 3:16

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

b: love identifies with others

John 11:32-36

³² Then, when Mary came where Jesus was, and saw Him, she fell down at His feet, saying to Him, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died." ³³ Therefore, when Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her weeping, He groaned in the spirit and was troubled. ³⁴ and He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to Him, "Lord, come and see." ³⁵ Jesus wept. ³⁶ Then the Jews said, "See how He loved him!"

5. a laborer has no comfort zones

"
