## Who do you say that He is?

### Matthew 16:13-15

<sup>13</sup>When Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, saying, “Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?” <sup>14</sup>So they said, “Some say John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” <sup>15</sup>He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?”

## Jesus the Healer

### Matthew 9:2

<sup>2</sup>Some men brought to Him a paralytic, lying on a mat. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, “Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven.”

### Matthew 9:20-22

<sup>20</sup>Just then a woman who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years came up behind Him and touched the edge of His cloak. <sup>21</sup>She said to herself, “If I only touch his cloak, I will be healed.” <sup>22</sup>Jesus turned and saw her, “Take heart, daughter,” He said, “your faith has healed you.”

### Matthew 9:27-29

<sup>27</sup>As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed him, calling out, “Have mercy on us, Son of David!” <sup>28</sup>When He had gone indoors, the blind men came to Him, and He asked them, “Do you believe that I am able to do this?” “Yes, Lord,” they replied. <sup>29</sup>Then He touched their eyes and said, “According to your faith will it be done to you”; and their sight was restored.

## Jesus the Provider

### Matthew 15:32-38

<sup>32</sup>Now Jesus called His disciples to Himself and said, “I have compassion on the multitude, because they have now continued with me three days and have nothing to eat. And I do not want to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way.” <sup>33</sup>Then His disciples said to Him, “Where could we get enough bread in the wilderness to fill such a great multitude?” <sup>34</sup>Jesus said to them, “How many loaves do you have?” And they said, “Seven, and a few little fish.” <sup>35</sup>So He commanded the multitude to sit down on the ground. <sup>36</sup>And He took the seven loaves and the fish and gave thanks, broke them and gave them to His disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitude. <sup>37</sup>So they all ate and were filled, and they took up seven large baskets full of the fragments that were left. <sup>38</sup>Now those who ate were four thousand men, besides women and children.

## Jesus the Saviour

### Ephesians 2:4-9

<sup>4</sup>But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, <sup>5</sup>even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ, <sup>6</sup>and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup>that in the ages to come he might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness towards us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup>For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, <sup>9</sup>not of works, lest anyone should boast.

## The way we walk

### 2 Corinthians 5:7

<sup>7</sup>“For we walk by faith, not by sight.”

## I never knew you

### Matthew 7:21-23

<sup>21</sup>“Not everyone who says to Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father in heaven. <sup>22</sup>Many will say to Me in that day, ‘Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?’ <sup>23</sup>”And then I will declare to them, ‘I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!’

## Lacking knowledge

### Hosea 4:6

<sup>6</sup>My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge I also will reject you from being priests for Me.

## Be a lover and not a user of God

### Philippians 3:3-11

<sup>3</sup>For we are the circumcision, who worship God in the Spirit, rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh, <sup>4</sup>though I also might have confidence in the flesh. If anyone else thinks he may have confidence in the flesh, I more so: <sup>5</sup>circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew; concerning the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup>concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. <sup>7</sup>But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. <sup>8</sup>Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ <sup>9</sup>and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith; <sup>10</sup>that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death, <sup>11</sup>if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection of the dead.
