

Atonement The means of reconciliation between humans and God. In the Old Testament atonement was made possible momentarily through the sacrificial system. In the New Testament, Atonement climaxes and concludes in the final work of Jesus (the final sacrifice) that is able to bring people to God.



Jesus' work of Atonement: 1. The Passive Obedience of Jesus won our Forgiveness

(Isa 53:5) But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.



(1Pe 2:24) He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.




2. The Active Obedience of Jesus imputed a record of righteousness into me


(Rom 5:19) For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.




(Php 3:9) and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—










As I remember the life and death of Jesus 3 promises and 3 prayers
