## Part 3:

**(Mark 1:17)** And Jesus said to them  
“Follow me, and I will make you  
become fishers of men”

**(Matt 28:19-20)** Go therefore and  
make disciples of all nations, baptizing  
them in the name of the Father and the  
Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching  
them to observe all that I have  
commanded you. And behold, I am  
with you always, to the end of the age.



**(Matt 9:35-37)** And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When He saw the crowds, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. **(Mark 3:16)** These are the twelve He appointed: Simon, whom he named Peter, and Andrew his brother, and James and John, and Philip, and Bartholomew,

**(Luke 6:15-17)** and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon who was called the Zealot, and Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor. Then Jesus came down with them and stood on a level place. A large crowd of His disciples was there, along with a great number of people from all over Judea, Jerusalem, and the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon.



**(Luke 6:18-19)** They had come to hear Him and to be healed of their diseases, and those troubled by unclean spirits were healed. The entire crowd was trying to touch Him, because power was coming from Him and healing them all.
