


For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.


## **The Parable of the Good Samaritan**






## The Parable of the Hidden Treasure




## The Parable of the Pearl of Great Price

**The Parable of the Lost Son**







**The Lost Son is celebrated**


