puffed up - v. 6, 18, 19

I Corinthians 5:1-2, 6-7a, 8

- ¹ It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you, and such sexual immorality as is not even named among the Gentiles—that a man has his father's wife!
- ² And you are **puffed up**, and have not rather mourned, that he who has done this deed might be taken away from among you.
- ⁶ Your glorying is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? ⁷ <u>Therefore purge</u> <u>out the old leaven</u>, that you may be a new lump...
- ⁸ Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

1. HYPOCRISY:

I Corinthians 5:11-13

¹¹ But now I have written to you not to keep company with anyone <u>named a brother</u>, who is sexually immoral, or covetous, or an idolater, or a reviler, or a drunkard, or an extortioner—not even to eat with such a person. ¹² For what have I to do with judging those also who are outside? Do you not judge those who are inside? ¹³ But those who are outside God judges. Therefore "<u>put away from yourselves the evil person</u>."

II Timothy 2:19

¹⁹ Nevertheless the solid foundation of God stands, having this seal: "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Let everyone who <u>names the name of Christ</u> depart from iniquity."

II Timothy 3:1-5

¹ But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: ² For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, ³ unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, ⁴ traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away!

- ¹⁸ If a man has a <u>stubborn and rebellious</u> son who will not obey the voice of his father or the voice of his mother, and who, <u>when they have chastened him</u>, <u>will not heed them</u>,
- ¹⁹ then his father and his mother shall take hold of him and bring him out to the elders of his city, to the gate of his city. ²⁰ And they shall say to the elders of his city, 'This son of ours is stubborn and rebellious; he will not obey our voice; he is a glutton and a drunkard.' ²¹ Then all the men of his city shall stone him to death with stones; so you shall **put away the evil from among you**, and all Israel shall hear and fear.

2. DIVISIVENESS:

Titus 3:9-11

⁹ But avoid foolish disputes, genealogies, contentions, and strivings about the law; for they are unprofitable and useless. ¹⁰ Reject <u>a divisive man</u> after the first and second admonition, ¹¹ knowing that such a person is warped and sinning, being self-condemned.

II Timothy 2:24-26

²⁴ And a servant of the Lord must not quarrel but be **gentle** to all, able to teach, **patient**, ²⁵ in **humility** correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth, ²⁶ and that they may come to their senses and escape the snare of the devil, having been taken captive by him to do his will.
