

The New Covenant

Jeremiah 31:31-34 (ESV)

31 "Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, 32 not like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, declares the Lord. 33 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Prophetic picture of the New Covenant

Ezekiel 36:25-38 (ESV)

25 I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. 26 And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. 27 And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules.[a] 28 You shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers, and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

Ephesians 2:1-3 (ESV)

1And you were dead in the trespasses and sins 2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— 3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body[a] and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.[b]

Ephesians 2:4-9 (ESV)

4 But[a] God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, 5 even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— 6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast

Romans 6:3-8 (ESV)

3 Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. 5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6 We know that our old self[a] was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free[b] from sin. 8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him

On Romans 6:3-4:

Those who are baptized have died to their old selves, are alive to God in Christ Jesus, and have put their faith in Jesus Christ for salvation. Baptism portrays what God has done for them in Christ. They have died and been buried with Christ and now have risen to a new life in him. Baptism functions as a pictorial representation of such, when believers are <u>submerged</u> under the waters and then <u>emerge again</u>. Thomas Schreiner

The association of Faith and Baptism

1.) Acts 8:12-13 English Standard Version (ESV)

12 But when they <u>believed</u> Philip as he <u>preached good news</u> about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were <u>baptized</u>, both men and women. 13 Even Simon himself <u>believed</u>, and after being <u>baptized</u> he continued with Philip. And seeing signs and great miracles[a] performed, he was amazed.

2.) Acts 10:43-48 English Standard Version (ESV)

43 To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who <u>believes</u> in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."
44 While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. 45 And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles.
46 For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, 47 "Can anyone <u>withhold</u> water for <u>baptizing</u> these people, who have **received the Holy Spirit** just as we have?" 48 And he commanded them to be <u>baptized</u> in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

The association of Faith and Baptism

3.) Acts 16:31-34 English Standard Version (ESV)

31 And they said, "<u>Believe</u> in the Lord Jesus, and you will be <u>saved</u>, you and your household." 32 And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. 33 And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was <u>baptized at once</u>, he and all his family. 34 Then he brought them up into his house and set food before them. And he rejoiced along with his entire household that he had <u>believed</u> in God.

4.) Acts 18:8 English Standard Version (ESV)

8 Crispus, the ruler of the synagogue, <u>believed</u> in the Lord, together with his entire household. And many of the Corinthians hearing Paul <u>believed</u> and were <u>baptized</u>.

The association of Faith and Baptism

5.) Acts 19:4-5 English Standard Version (ESV)

4 And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to <u>believe</u> in the one who was to come after him, that is, <u>Jesus</u>." 5 On hearing this, they were <u>baptized</u> in[a] the name of the Lord Jesus.

Acts 2:36-41 New Living Translation (NLT)

- 36 "So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah!"
- 37 Peter's words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles, "*Brothers, what should we do?*" 38 Peter replied, "Each of you must <u>repent of your sins</u> and turn to God, and be <u>baptized</u> in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 This promise is to you, to your children, and to those far away[a]—all who have been called by the Lord our God." 40 Then Peter continued preaching for a long time, strongly urging all his listeners, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation!"

1 Corinthians 12:13 English Standard Version (ESV)

13 For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves[a] or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

The Multifaceted Nature of the Conversion Experience in Acts

From what we have seen in Acts with respect to becoming a Christian, we can come to the following conclusion: In the experience of becoming a Christian, five integrally related components took place at the same time, usually on the same day:

- repentance
- faith,
- confession
- receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit,
- and baptism.

The interrelatedness of these five components is shown by their <u>appearance together</u> in <u>various accounts</u> in Acts. Robert Stein
