## **2.1 David vs Goliath:** 1 Samuel 17 (HCSB)

<sup>31</sup> What David said was overheard and reported to Saul, so he had David brought to him. <sup>32</sup> David said to Saul, "Don't let anyone be discouraged by him; your servant will go and fight this Philistine!" <sup>33</sup> But Saul replied, "You can't go fight this Philistine. You're just a youth, and he's been a warrior since he was young." <sup>34</sup> David answered Saul: "Your servant has been tending his father's sheep. Whenever a lion or a bear came and carried off a lamb from the flock, <sup>35</sup> I went after it, struck it down, and rescued the lamb from its mouth. If it reared up against me, I would grab it by its fur, strike it down, and kill it.



<sup>36</sup> Your servant has killed lions and bears; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, for he has defied the armies of the living God." <sup>37</sup> Then David said, "<u>The Lord who</u> rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine." Saul said to David, "Go, and may the Lord be with you."



## 2.2 Israel's deliverance:

#### Psalm 105 (HCSB) God's Faithfulness to His People

<sup>1</sup> Give thanks to Yahweh, call on His name; proclaim His deeds among the peoples. <sup>2</sup> Sing to Him, sing praise to Him; tell about all His wonderful works! <sup>3</sup> Honor His holy name; let the hearts of those who seek Yahweh rejoice.<sup>4</sup> Search for the Lord and for His strength; seek His face always. <sup>5</sup> Remember the wonderful works He has done, His wonders, and the judgments He has pronounced, <sup>6</sup> you offspring of Abraham His servant, Jacob's descendants—His chosen ones.



<sup>7</sup> He is the Lord our God; His judgments govern the whole earth.

<sup>8</sup> He remembers His covenant forever, the promise He ordained for a thousand generations— <sup>9</sup> the covenant He made with Abraham, swore to Isaac, <sup>10</sup> and confirmed to Jacob as a decree and to Israel as an everlasting covenant:
<sup>11</sup> "I will give the land of Canaan to you

as your inherited portion.".....

.....<sup>16</sup> He called down famine against the land


and destroyed the entire food supply. <sup>17</sup> He had sent a man ahead of them— Joseph, who was sold as a slave. <sup>18</sup> They hurt his feet with shackles; his neck was put in an iron collar.



<sup>19</sup> Until the time his prediction came true, the word of the Lord tested him. <sup>20</sup> The king sent for him and released him; the ruler of peoples set him free. <sup>21</sup> He made him master of his household, ruler over all his possessions— <sup>22</sup> binding his officials at will and instructing his elders. <sup>23</sup> Then Israel went to Egypt; Jacob lived as a foreigner in the land of Ham.<sup>24</sup> The Lord made His people very fruitful; He made them more numerous than their foes, <sup>25</sup> whose hearts He turned to hate His people and to deal deceptively with His servants.



<sup>37</sup> Then He brought Israel out with silver and gold, and no one among His tribes stumbled. <sup>38</sup> Egypt was glad when they left, for the dread of Israel had fallen on them. <sup>39</sup> He spread a cloud as a covering and gave a fire to light up the night. <sup>40</sup> They asked, and He brought quail and satisfied them with bread from heaven. <sup>41</sup> He opened a rock, and water gushed out; it flowed like a stream in the desert. <sup>42</sup> For He remembered His holy promise to Abraham His servant. <sup>43</sup> He brought His people out with rejoicing, His chosen ones with shouts of joy. <sup>44</sup> He gave them the lands of the nations, and they inherited what other peoples had worked for.



<sup>45</sup> All this happened so that they might keep His statutes
and obey His instructions.

### Joshua 4 (HCSB)

#### **The Memorial Stones**

After the entire nation had finished crossing the Jordan, the Lord spoke to Joshua: <sup>2</sup> "Choose 12 men from the people, one man for each tribe, <sup>3</sup> and command them: Take 12 stones from this place in the middle of the Jordan where the priests are standing, carry them with you, and set them down at the place where you spend the night." <sup>4</sup> So Joshua summoned the 12 men he had selected from the Israelites, one man for each tribe, <sup>5</sup> and said to them,



"Go across to the ark of the Lord your God in the middle of the Jordan. Each of you lift a stone onto his shoulder, one for each of the Israelite tribes, <sup>6</sup> so that this will be a sign among you. In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean to you?' <sup>7</sup> you should tell them, 'The waters of the Jordan were cut off in front of the ark of the Lord's covenant. When it crossed the Jordan, the Jordan's waters were cut off.' Therefore these stones will always be a memorial for the Israelites." <sup>8</sup> The Israelites did just as Joshua had commanded them. The 12 men took stones from the middle of the Jordan, one for each of the Israelite tribes, just as the Lord had told Joshua. They carried them to the camp and set them down there.



<sup>9</sup> Joshua also set up 12 stones in the middle of the Jordan where the priests who carried the ark of the covenant were standing. The stones are there to this day...

... <sup>19</sup> The people came up from the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, and camped at Gilgal on the eastern limits of Jericho. <sup>20</sup> Then Joshua set up in Gilgal the 12 stones they had taken from the Jordan, <sup>21</sup> and he said to the Israelites, "In the future, when your children ask their fathers, 'What is the meaning of these stones?'



<sup>22</sup> you should tell your children, 'Israel crossed the Jordan on dry ground.<sup>23</sup> For the Lord your God dried up the waters of the Jordan before you until you had crossed over, just as the Lord your God did to the Red Sea, which He dried up before us until we had <u>crossed over. <sup>24</sup> This is so</u> that all the people of the earth may know that the Lord's hand is mighty, and so that you may always fear the Lord your God."
