1Corinthians 10:16

The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?

3.1 definition:

communion

(kə myun yən)

- 1. Holy Communion
- 2. a group of persons having a common religious faith; denomination: *Anglican communion*.
- 3. interchange or sharing of thoughts or emotions: *communion with nature*.
- 4. the act of sharing, or holding in common; participation.

3.1 definition: GREEK

koinōnia koy-nohn-ee'-ah

From <u>G2844</u>; partnership, that is, (literally) participation, or (social) intercourse, or (pecuniary) benefaction: - (to) communicate (-ation), communion, (contri-), distribution, fellowship.

- a. to come into communion or <u>fellowship</u>, to become a sharer, be made a partner
 b. to enter into <u>fellowship</u>, join oneself as an
- associate, make oneself a sharer or partner

4. communion: Scripture

1 Corinthians 11:23-34 (HCSB)

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: On the night when He was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took bread, ²⁴ gave thanks, broke it, and said, "This is My body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of Me."

²⁵ In the same way, after supper He also took the cup and said, "This cup is the new covenant established by My blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

4. communion: Scripture

²⁷ Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy way will be guilty of sin against the body and blood of the Lord. 28 So a man should examine himself; in this way he should eat the bread and drink from the cup. 29 For whoever eats and drinks without recognizing the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself. 30 This is why many are sick and ill among you, and many have fallen asleep. 31 If we were properly evaluating ourselves, we would not be judged, ³² but when we are judged, we are disciplined by the Lord, so that we may not be condemned with the world.

4. communion: Scripture

³³ Therefore, my brothers, when you come together to eat, wait for one another. ³⁴ If anyone is hungry, he should eat at home, so that when you gather together you will not come under judgment. And I will give instructions about the other matters whenever I come.

5. why communion?

a) When we observe Communion we show our participation in the body of Christ. His life becomes our life and we become members of each other:

1 Corinthians 10:16-17

¹⁶ The cup of blessing that we give thanks for, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ?

¹⁷ Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for all of us share that one bread.

5. why communion?

- b) We observe Communion because the Lord told us to. His commands: 1 Corinthians 11:24
- c)In observing Communion we are remembering Christ and all that He has done for us in His life, death and resurrection: 1 Corinthians 11:24
- d)When observing Communion we take time to examine ourselves: 1 Corinthians 11:28
- e)In observing Communion we are proclaiming His death until He comes. It is a statement of faith: 1 Corinthians 11:26
