# We are Family

Romans 12:10-13

**Be devoted** to one another with [authentic] **brotherly** affection [as members of one family], give preference to one another in honour; never lagging behind in diligence; aglow in the Spirit, enthusiastically serving the Lord; constantly rejoicing in hope [because of our confidence in Christ], steadfast and patient in distress, devoted to prayer [continually seeking wisdom, guidance, and strength], 13 contributing to the needs of God's people, pursuing [the practice of] hospitality.

- think highly of: appreciate, value, prize, cherish

### 1 Peter 3:8-12 (MSG)

8-12 Summing up: Be agreeable, be sympathetic, be loving, be compassionate, **be humble**. That goes for all of you, no exceptions. No retaliation. No sharp-tongued sarcasm. Instead, **bless—that's your job, to bless**. You'll be a blessing and also get a blessing.

### Romans 12: 4-10, 14-19, 21 (MSG)

4-6In this way we are like the various parts of a human body. Each part gets its meaning from the body as a whole, not the other way around. The body we're talking about is Christ's body of chosen people. Each of us finds our meaning and function as a part of his body. But as a chopped-off finger or cut-off toe we wouldn't amount to much, would we? So since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvelously functioning parts in Christ's body, let's just go ahead and be what we were made to be, without enviously or pridefully comparing ourselves with each other, or trying to be something we aren't.

6-8 If you preach, just preach God's Message, nothing else; if you help, just help, don't take over; if you teach, stick to your teaching; if you give encouraging guidance, be careful that you don't get bossy; if you're put in charge, don't manipulate; if you're called to give aid to people in distress, keep your eyes open and be quick to respond; if you work with the disadvantaged, don't let yourself get irritated with them or depressed by them. Keep a smile on your face.

9-10 Love from the centre of who you are; don't fake it. Run for dear life from evil; hold on for dear life to good. Be good friends who love deeply; practice playing second fiddle...

14-16 Bless your enemies; no cursing under your breath. Laugh with your happy friends when they're happy; share tears when they're down. Get along with each other; don't be stuck-up. Make friends with nobodies; don't be the great somebody.

17-19 Don't hit back; **discover beauty in everyone.** If you've got it in you, get along with everybody. Don't insist on getting even; that's not for you to do. "I'll do the judging," says God. "I'll take care of it."...
21...Don't let evil get the best of you; get the best of evil by doing good.

# CREATE A CULTURE OF HONOUR

Use Words that Build

### 1 Thessalonians 5:9-21

- 9 For God has not appointed us to [incur His] wrath [He did not select us to condemn us], but [that we might] obtain [His] salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ (the Messiah)
- 10 Who died for us so that whether we are still alive or are dead [at Christ's appearing], we might live together with Him and share His life.
- 11 Therefore **encourage** (admonish, exhort) one another and **edify** (strengthen and build up) one another, **just as you are doing.**

12 Now also we beseech you, brethren, **get to know** those who labour among you [recognize them for what they are, acknowledge and appreciate and respect them all]—your leaders who are over you in the Lord and those who warn and kindly reprove and exhort you.

13 And hold them in very high and most affectionate esteem in [intelligent and sympathetic] appreciation of their work. Be at peace among yourselves.

14 And we earnestly beseech you, brethren, **admonish** (warn and seriously advise) those who are out of line [the loafers, the disorderly, and the unruly]; **encourage** the timid and fainthearted, **help and give your support** to the weak souls, [and] be very patient with everybody [always keeping your temper].

15 See that none of you repays another with evil for evil, but always aim to show kindness and seek to do good to one another and to everybody.

### Embrace Inspired Instruction, Exhortation or Warning

### 1Thessalonians 5: 19-21

19 Do not quench (suppress or subdue) the [Holy] Spirit; 20 Do not spurn the gifts and utterances of the prophets [do not depreciate prophetic revelations nor despise inspired instruction or exhortation or warning].

21 But test and prove all things [until you can recognize] what is good; [to that] hold fast.

### Test the Words

### Matthew 12:20 (MSG)

I've placed my Spirit on him; he'll **decree justice** to the nations. But he won't yell, won't raise his voice; there'll be no commotion in the streets. He won't walk over anyone's feelings, won't push you into a corner. Before you know it, his justice will triumph;

"A bruised reed He will not break, a smouldering wick He will not put out..." (NIV)

## Why Prophesy?

### 1 Cor 14:3 (AMP)

<sup>3</sup> But [on the other hand] the one who prophesies speaks to people for **edification** [to promote their spiritual growth] and [speaks words of] **encouragement** [to uphold and advise them concerning the matters of God] and [speaks words of] **consolation** [to compassionately comfort them].

- edify / build up / strengthen
  - exhort / encourage
  - comfort / help the weak
    - admonish / warn

(the unruly, disorderly, loafers - 1 Thessalonians 5:9-15)

You need to KNOW people to be able to distinguish between the weak who need comfort and the loafers, disorderly and unruly.

How do we love and build into imperfect, failing people?

Christ in us, the Hope of Glory

### Colossians 1:24-29

<sup>24</sup> Now I rejoice in my sufferings on your behalf. And with my own body I supplement whatever is lacking [on our part] of Christ's afflictions, on behalf of His body, which is the church. <sup>25</sup> In this church I was made a minister according to the stewardship which God entrusted to me for your sake, so that I might make the word of God fully known [among you]— 26 that is, the mystery which was hidden [from angels and mankind] for ages and generations, but has now been revealed to His saints (God's people).

<sup>27</sup> God [in His eternal plan] chose to make known to them how great for the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in and among you, the hope and guarantee of [realizing the] glory. <sup>28</sup> We proclaim Him, warning and instructing everyone in all wisdom [that is, with comprehensive insight into the word and purposes of God], so that we may present every person complete in Christ [mature, fully trained, and perfect in Him—the Anointed]. 29 For this I labour [often to the point of exhaustion], striving with His power and energy, which so greatly works within me.
