

3. JOY, the Command:



Know Him, Trust Him Obey when COMMANDS

Joy and Joyful:

The Greek word for "rejoice" in 1 Thessalonians 5:16 is chairete (χαίρετε), which shares its root with the word for "joy," chara (χαρά). Both terms stem from the root char- (grace or favor), highlighting their deep connection to divine grace. Joy (chara) is often seen as the inner state of delight resulting from God's work, while rejoicing (chairete) is the outward expression of that joy.





1. Joy is essential and not optional

2. God only commands what is possible, through His grace and not what is impossible

3. His command is because of His love

Rejoicing is a command by God

Israel:

- "Let Israel be glad in his Maker; let the children of Zion rejoice in their King!" **Psalm 149:2**
- "Let Jacob rejoice, let Israel be glad" Psalm 14:7

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4. The Joy-command for flourishing:

4.1 Scripture:

1 Thessalonians 5 | Exhortations and Blessings

14 And we exhort you, brothers: warn those who are irresponsible, comfort the discouraged, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 15 See to it that no one repays evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good for one another and for all.

16 Rejoice always!

17 Pray constantly.

18 Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 19 Don't stifle the Spirit. 20 Don't despise prophecies, 21 but test all things. Hold on to what is good. 22 Stay away from every kind of evil.

4.3 Practically for us:

God commands are for our good and for us to flourish:

16 Rejoice always! / Always be joyful

17 Pray constantly.

18 Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.
