1. we have been created in God's image

Genesis 1:26a, 27 (ESV)

^{26a} Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness... ²⁷So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

a: the purpose of prayer

2. we have been created to rule

Genesis 1:27a, 28 (ESV)

²⁷So God created man ... ²⁸ And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and SUBDUE it and HAVE DOMINION/RULE over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

a: the purpose of prayer3. establishing the purposes of God

God's desire is for us to do His will. His will should be:

- The centre of our prayers: and
- The source of our confidence.

a: the purpose of prayer

1 John 5:14-15 (ESV)

¹⁴ And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that <u>if we ask anything</u> <u>according to his will he hears us</u>. ¹⁵ And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

a: the purpose of prayer

4. our will versus God's will

James 4:2c-3 (ESV)

² ... You do not have, because you do not ask. ³ You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions.

a: the purpose of prayer

5. the word of God

- 1. We must pray according to God's will, as revealed through His Word.
- 2. Power in prayer is based on the Word of God, e.g. His promises.

2 Corinthians 1:10 (ESV)

²⁰ For all God's promises are "Yes" in him (Jesus). And so through him we can say "Amen," to the glory of God.

a: the purpose of prayer

6. Jesus lives to do the will of the Father

John 4:34; 5:30; 6:38 (ESV)

3:34 "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work."

5:30 "I seek not my own will but the will of him who sent me."

^{6:38} "For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me."



b: our authority

1. our redemptive purpose

Ephesians 3:10-12 (ESV)

¹⁰ so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹ This was according to the eternal purpose that he has realised in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹² in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him.

b: our authority

1. our redemptive purpose

2 Corinthians 6:1 (GNB)

¹ In our work together with God, then, we beg you who have received God's grace not to let it be wasted.

1 Corinthians 3:9 (ESV)

⁹ For we are God's fellow workers.

b: our authority

2. Jesus disarmed rulers and authorities

Colosians 2:13-15 (NKJ)

13 And you, who were dead in your trespasses..., God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses,
 14 by cancelling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands.
 This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.
 15 He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame...

b: our authority

3. all authority was given to Jesus

Matthew 28:18 (ESV)

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All **authority** in heaven and on earth has been given to me..."

Colosians 1:13 (YLT)

¹³ who did rescue us out of the <u>authority</u> of the darkness, and did translate us into the reign of the Son of His love...

b: our authority

4. Jesus transferred authority to believers

Luke 10:19 (ESV)

¹⁹ Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you.

b: our authority

4. Jesus transferred authority to believers

Matthew 18:18-19 (ESV)

¹⁸ "Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will have been bound in heaven, and whatever you permit on earth will have been permitted in heaven. ¹⁹ Furthermore, truly I tell you that if two of you agree on earth about anything you request, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven."

b: our authority

4. Jesus transferred authority to believers

Romans 5:17 (ESV)

¹⁷ For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

b: our authority

5. authority through the name of Jesus

John 16:23-24 (ESV)

²³ "... Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. ²⁴ Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full."



c: we need faith

1. we need faith

Matthew 17:20; 21:21 (ESV)

17:20 ... if you <u>have faith</u> like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you."

^{21:21} "... if you have faith and do not doubt, ... if you say to this mountain, 'Be taken up and thrown into the sea,' it will happen.

c: we need faith

1. we need faith

James 1:5-7 (ESV)

⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, ... and it will be given him. ⁶ But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord...

c: we need faith

2. faith pleases God

Hebrews 11:6; 4:16 (ESV)

^{11:6} And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

^{4:16} Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

c: we need faith

3. all things are possible

Rom 10:11 (ESV)

¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame."

Mat 19:26b (ESV)

^{26b} "... with God all things are possible."

Mar 9:23 (ESV)

And Jesus said to him, "...All things are possible for one who believes."



d: the model prayer

Mat 6:9-13 (ESV)

⁹ "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. ⁹ Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹⁰ Give us this day our daily bread, ¹¹ and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹² And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. ¹³ For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen "

d: the model prayer

1. Our Father in heaven

We bring to our Father the concerns of others, as well as ourselves, acknowledging Him as our source. He is the Father of all believers.

2. Hallowed be your name

We worship the Father as the Holy One, glorifying all His attributes.

d: the model prayer

3. <u>Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven</u>

We pray the will and purposes of our Father into being on earth; in peoples lives, the church etc. (before praying for ourselves.)

4. Give us this day our daily bread

We ask our Father to supply the daily needs of others, as well as our own.

d: the model prayer

5. <u>and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors</u>

We have to bring our own sins and where people have hurt us before the Father. We ask for forgiveness and we extend forgiveness to others.

6. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

We need wisdom to avoid temptation and to deliver us when we do face temptation.

d: the model prayer

7. For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen

Jesus are teaching us to end our time in prayer with worship the Father again. We give thanks in advance for answered prayers.



e: effectual fervent prayer

James 5:16b (KJV)

^{16b} The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

James 5:16b (ESV)

The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.

e: effectual fervent prayer

James 5:17-18 (KJV)

¹⁷ Elijah was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. ¹⁸ And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.



f: so how often do we pray?

Acts 2:42 (ESV)

⁴² And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

The church was built on these 4 pillars, one of them PRAYER.

f: so how often do we pray?

Colossians 4:2 (ESV)

² Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving.

Eph 6:18 (ESV)

¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints.

f: so how often do we pray?

1 Peter 5:8 (ESV)

⁸ Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.



g: persevere

1. do not lose heart

Luke 18:1-8 (ESV)

¹ And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. ² ... "In a city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. ³ And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' ^{4a} For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself,

g: persevere 1. do not lose heart

Luke 18:1-8 (ESV)

^{4b} 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. ⁷ And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them?
