What Paul means here when he talks about "Kingdom of God" 1) he means the reign of God, not the realm of God. 2) the kingdom of God refers to His saving reign, not to his total providence over all things. 3) the kingdom of God is fulfilled partially in the present and will be consummated at the end of the age when Christ comes a second time. 4) the kingdom of God and the kingdom of Christ are the same.
