

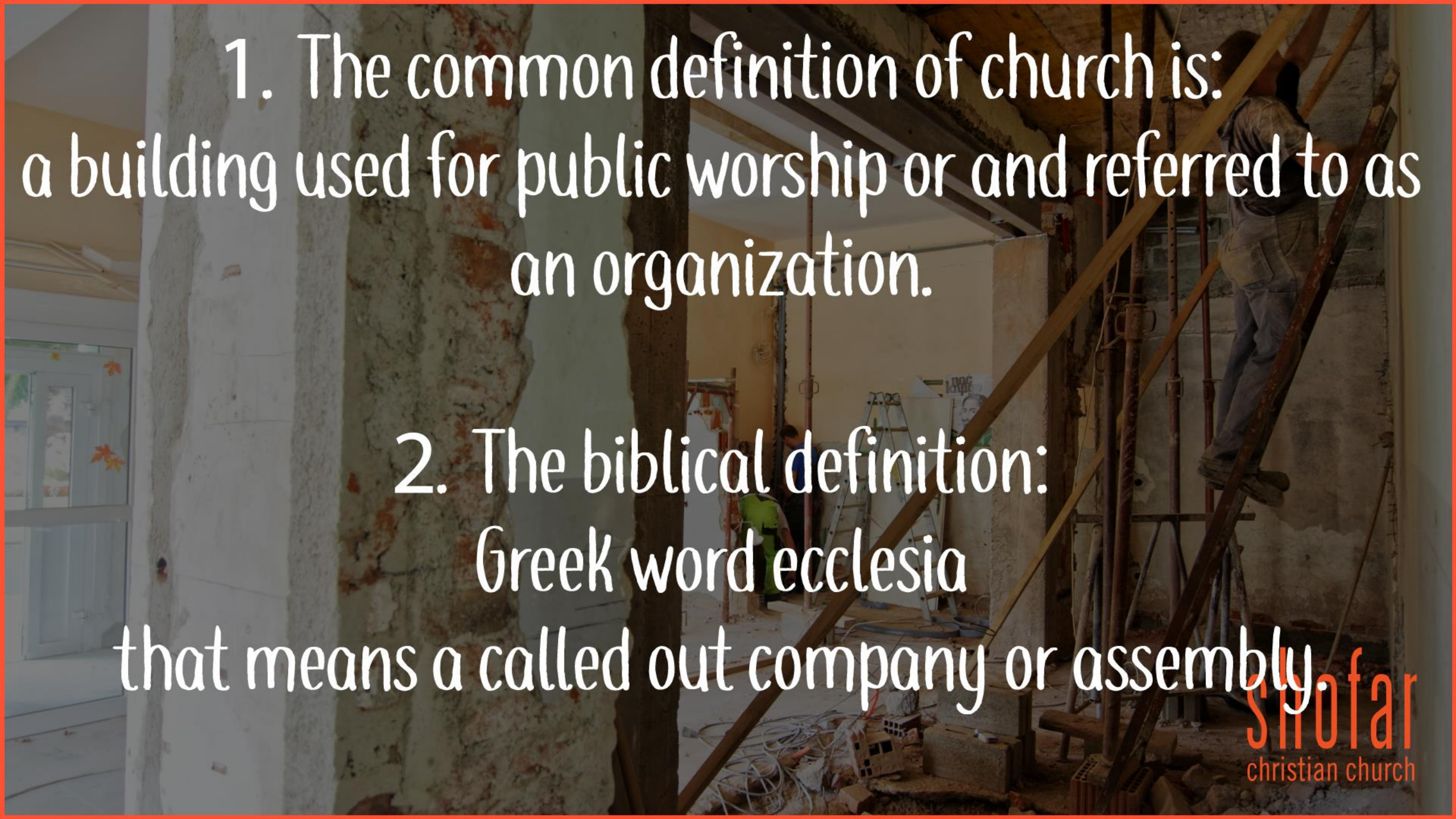

busies himself with his own house.




1. The common definition of church is:

that means a called out company or assembly.


Ephesians 2:19-22 (NLT)




Matt 26:36 (ESV)
